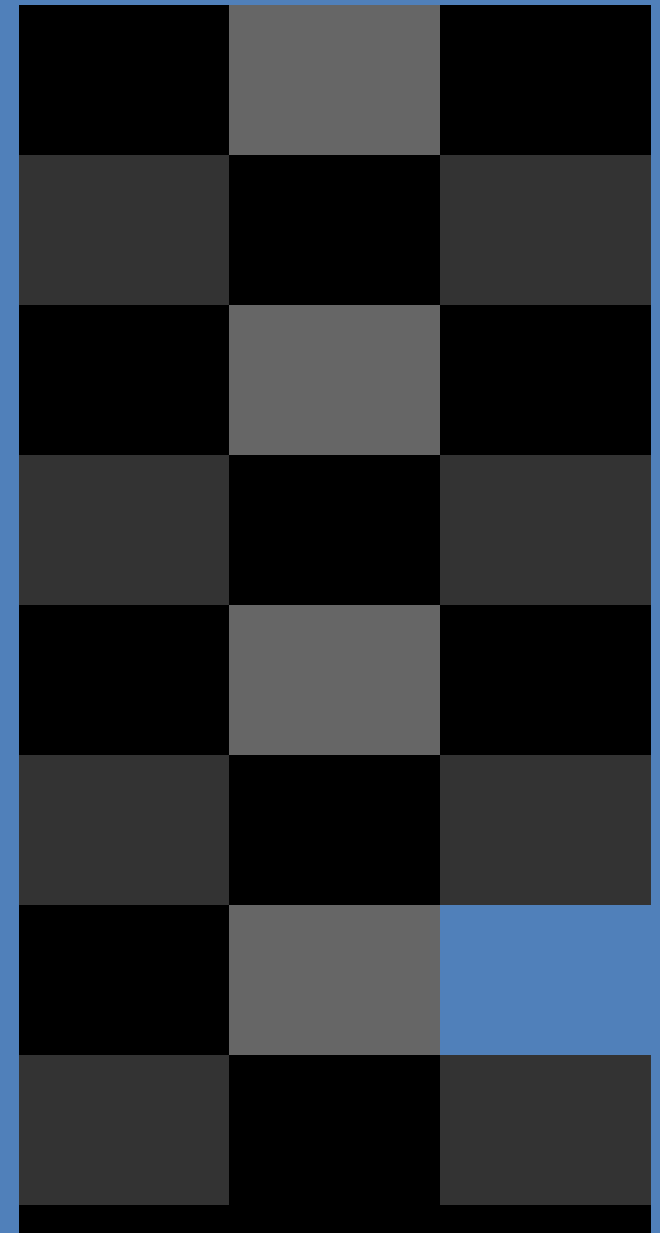

One City/One Community is a project in Bedford-Stuyvesant that wants to help you. If you live in the neighborhood and have city agencies involved in your life, One City/One Community may be able to give you the help you need.

One City/One Community can help by:

- Bringing together all the people that want to help you;
- Identifying problems you are having with getting services;
- Getting your case dealt with quickly; and
- Coming up with solutions that work.
